General Sheep Rules:

Market Lambs and Commercial Ewes must be exhibited by a Junior. A Junior is considered any youth old enough to show without help. Exhibitors can show no more than 3 Market Lambs and 3 Commercial Ewes. All sheep must be weighed on grounds and will be weighed only once. All Sheep must have scrapie tags and current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection. Pens will be available on a first come first basis. There will be 3 divisions of showmanship based on the grade the junior is currently in. The divisions will be:

Junior---5th grade and younger

Junior High---6th-8th grades

Senior High---9th-12th grades

For showmanship exhibitors may show either Commercial Ewes or Market Lambs.

Commercial Ewes

1. Exhibitors may show no more than 3 head of Commercial Ewes.
2. Open to nonregistered yearling ewes and ewe lambs of any breed or combination of breeds. Ewe lambs must have milk teeth and yearlings must have no more than 4 permanent teeth.
3. Commercial Ewes will be weighed and divided in classes by weight and by age (lambs & yearlings). If there are 10 or more head of hair sheep entered, show management will divide classes by weight, age and type---meaning hair breed lots will not show against wool breed lots.
4. Ewe lambs shown as Commercial Ewes cannot show as Market Lambs.

Market Lambs

1. Exhibitors may show no more than 4 Market Lambs.
2. Market Lambs may be either wether or ewe lambs and must have milk teeth. Ewes shown in the Market Lamb Division are not eligible to show in the Commercial Ewe Show.
3. Lambs will be weighed and divided into classes by weight. If there are 10 or more head of hair sheep entered, show management will divide classes by both weight and type----meaning hair breed lots will not show against wool breed lots.

The Perry Century Farm

(1918 – Current)



Johnny Bascom Perry who lived in Winston County, Alabama, wrote "In 1911 my brother and I set out as 'spies' to view the 'promised land' in Lawrence County, Tennessee. It was a three-day journey by mule and buggy, and we spent a week looking over the county. We returned home and reported that it was 'a good land and we would possess it.' In 1918 my wife, young daughter and I made the long journey to our new home in a wagon drawn by a pair of small mules. When we crossed the state line we stopped for lunch and I prayed that God would bless us in this new land." Johnny Bascom Perry cleared the land and built a home. The first products raised were corn, cotton and dark-fired tobacco. Later an 18-acre orchard was established and Perry apples were much in demand. As years went by his son, grandsons and great-grandson worked the land producing chickens for the market, and operating a dairy. The Perry Farm currently produces corn, soybeans and beef cattle. This farm has been worked continuously by four generations of Perrys. The 96-acre farm is located on 312 Valley Road, Lawrenceburg, TN. Current Owner: Roy Perry.

The Hill Century Farm

(1918 – Current)



In 1906 Daniel Webster Hill and his sister Lo left Blue Earth Minnesota on an Excursion Train that was offered by the railroads to sell land. Webster and Lo looked at land between Chicago and Mobile Alabama. They chose Ethridge, Tennessee. Webster purchased land on Hudson Road, Lo on Redhill Road. A sawmill was established, barns and houses were built. On February 3, 1918 Webster and his wife Gertie with 2 small children moved into their home. They grew corn, wheat, oats, hay, cotton and tobacco. They also raised cattle, hogs and chickens. During this time three more children were born. After Webster's death in 1942 his wife Gertie along with her sons Daniel (17) and Roscoe (14) managed the farm. Daniel and Roscoe grew one of the first soybean crops in Lawrence County. They got the soybean seed from family in Minnesota. It made a good crop but no one in this area purchased soybeans. But thankfully Beuerlein Brothers Feed and Seed found a buyer in Memphis. Daniel married Alice Perry and moved to Webster's farm in Minnesota. With the passing of Gertie Hill in 1957, the farm was passed to Roscoe and his wife Ruth Gobble Hill. Roscoe and Ruth grew corn, soybeans, wheat, oats, alfalfa hay and tobacco. They raised cattle, hogs and chickens. Ruth was in charge of selling eggs to Swift and Company. Roscoe added a Grade A Dairy, milking registered Gurneys. Roscoe artificially inseminated all his cows, never owning a bull. Roscoe and Ruth's daughter Mary Ann Hollman and husband Andy own and live on the farm today. Alex Lampley, Daniel Webster Hill's, great grandson farms the land today.
